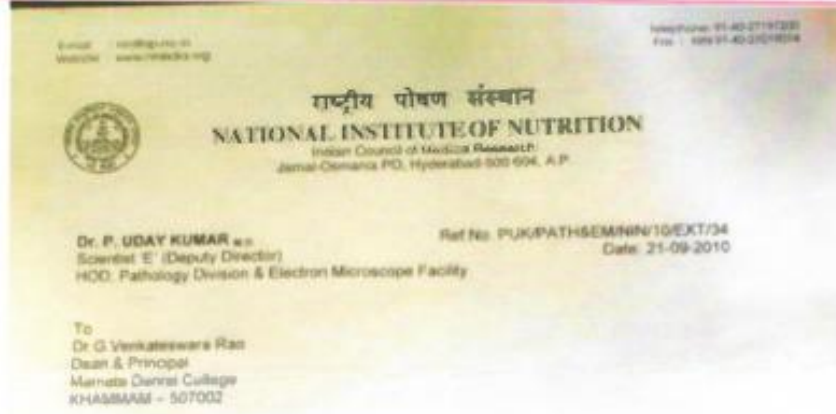

## ARTICLE 1: STUDENT EXCHANGES

1. The primary purpose of this agreement is to establish a clinical student exchange program between the Mamata Dental College (MDC), Telangana, India, and the Mamata Medical College (MMC), Khammam, Telangana
2. The exact number of students exchanged per year (up to six) shall be by mutual agreement and may not necessarily be exactly in balance. The number of students exchanged will be subject to availability of the designated clinical tutor's/preceptor's and institution's capability to absorb the students into the daily operation. The number of students exchanged in any year must be approved in writing by the Dean of the accepting college.
3. Each institution, conforming to the admission requirements of the host institution' shall accept and enroll exchange students for a period of clinical education experiences lasting upto two months. The host institution will not consider the exchange student an employee of the institution, but rather a student in the clinical education phase of his/her professional education. Each institution will assume full responsibility in the assessment and selection of qualified candidates. These students will have completed, at least, four years of their course at their home institution.
4. Eligibility for participation in this Exchange will be determined without regard to race, sex, color, religion, sexual orientation, marital status, national origin, age, or beliefs, both institutions does not discriminate on the basis of race, color, national origin, ethnic origin, religion, creed, age, physical or mental disability, veteran status, uniformed service, political belief, sex, sexual orientation, gender identity, gender expression, pregnancy, marital status, genetic information, social or economic status.
5. All students, by accepting a place on the Exchange Program, agree to abide by the Regulations, Rules and Statutes of the host institution and its governmental entities.
6. Exchange students will receive the services normally provided to the home students of each institution and will have the same rights and responsibilities afforded to the home students. In addition, the host institution undertakes to provide specific assistance to incoming students with regard to accommodation, induction and orientation to the host environment.
7. Students participating in the exchange will be responsible for paying their individual tuition fees at their home institutions.
8. Students will also be responsible for transportation costs to and from the receiving institution. Students are responsible for all costs incurred at the host institution, those involving books, stationery, study materials and course-specific fees such as key deposits, cost of fieldwork, laboratory deposits. In addition, students will pay their own accommodation (room and board) and living costs. Students are responsible for the costs of health and other insurance in line with current regulations in the host institution and as may be varied from time to time by that institution. Students must comply with all Health Regulations currently in force in host institution.
9. The obligations of each institution are limited under this agreement to the exchange of students and do not extend to partners or dependents. Expenses of accompanying partners and/or dependents are the responsibility of the exchange student.

10. Default of any payment due to the host institution will be considered default in the home institution and the appropriate sanctions will be applied by the home institution to attempt to recover such debt on behalf of the host institution.
11. The nature of the experiences shall be jointly arranged by the student's program at the home institution, and by the designated preceptor/clinical tutor at the host institution. The home institution shall give at least ninety (90) days' notice of the student's assignment to the designated preceptor at the host institution. The host institution reserves the right of final approval of the admission of a student. The academic program for each student shall have been determined before departure and shall be agreed between the appropriate members of Academic Staff/Faculty in the home and host institutions according to their normal custom and practice. The home institution will also specify any credit arising from courses/modules and practice. The home institution will also specify any credit arising from courses/modules taken at the host institution that will be allowed to count to the award of the home institution. The host institution's clinical tutor/preceptor shall provide learning objectives and guidelines of the clinical education experience. and shall provide written communication regarding the student's performance in providing clinical experiences. The host institution may withdraw a student from his/her clinical education experience when, in the host institution's judgement, the clinical experiences do not meet the needs of the student.
12. The host institution, and the designated chief clinical tutor/preceptor, shall, where applicable:
  - a. Provide clinical educational experiences as stated in the objectives and guidelines from the host institution, and supervision appropriate to the academic and clinical level of assigned students.
  - b. Provide the physical facilities and other equipment necessary for clinical education experiences.
  - c. Request that the College withdraw a student from his/her assigned clinical education experiences.
  - d. Request that the College withdraw a student from his/her assigned clinical education experience, when his/her conduct or performance is unsatisfactory.
  - e. Complete forms requested by the College, such as: general information forms, student evaluation report, etc.
13. The student shall:
  - a. Have the responsibility of transportation to and from the host institution, and on any reasonable special assignment by the designated preceptor.
  - b. Be responsible for his/her own illness.
  - c. Complete health forms requested by the designated clinical tutor/preceptor and host institution, if applicable.
  - d. Be responsible for following the administrative policies of the designated clinical tutor/preceptor and/or host institution.
  - e. Be responsible for providing his/her own clinical lab costs.
  - f. Notify the designated clinical tutor/preceptor of his/her intended time of arrival, and be responsible for reporting to the designated individual at the host institution on time.
  - g. Have an enrollment proposal, approved both by the home institution and the host institution and be deemed academically qualified to successfully complete the designated subjects at the host institution.

- h. Have good knowledge of the English language for those attending UKY. Other language skills may be required by either institution. This will be verified on request by the host institution.
14. The home institution shall send only such students as are, to the home institution's knowledge, in good health at the time of reporting for their clinical education. The home institution shall forward to the designated clinical tutor/preceptor a summary of the student's training and experience, which shall include at least information on the student's general health, related education and experience.


#### ARTICLE 2: TERMS

1. This agreement shall be in effect with the 2015-2016 academic year. The term of this agreement shall be from the date of last signature for lifetime.
2. This agreement shall be reviewed, evaluated and adjusted, if needed, every three years. It may be terminated, at the end of the academic year in progress, by either party, by official, written notification duly signed by the appropriate officer of the notifying party. This written notification duly signed by the appropriate officer of the notifying party. This written notification to the other institution must be delivered before the end of October preceding the beginning of the next academic year.
3. In the event of the agreement not being renewed at the end of the initial three-year period, whilst an exchange imbalance exists, the agreement shall be deemed to be extended for a period of two years, from such date of expiry, for the specific and sole purpose of rectifying the existing imbalance.

#### ARTICLE 3: PRINCIPAL CONTACTS FOR THE AGREEMENT

Each party will designate a coordinator to facilitate the cooperation development and conduction of the various activities.

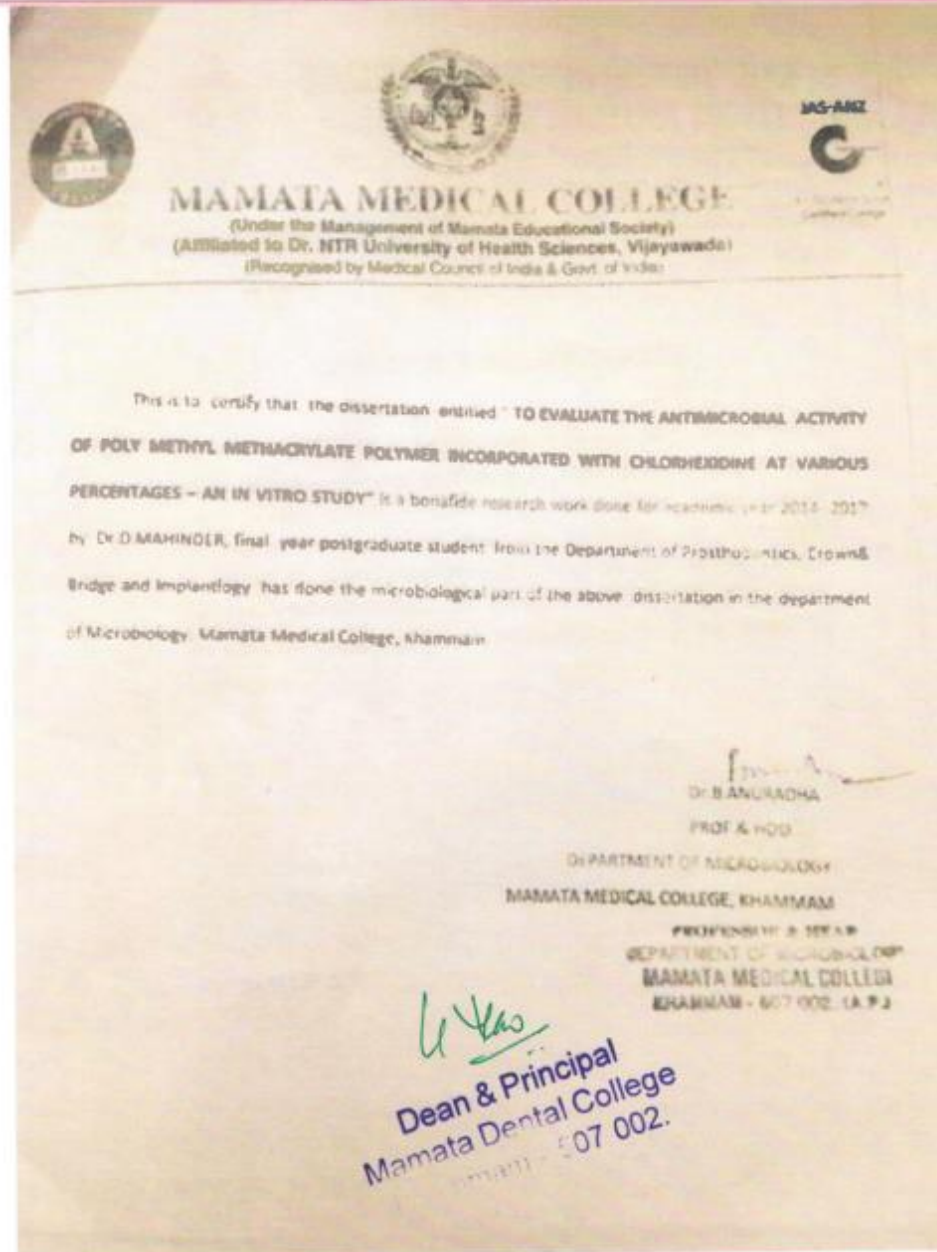

## AGREEMENT

Between  
Missouri State University  
And  
Mamata Dental College

This Agreement is made and entered into this XX day of XXX, 2014 between and by the following parties:

Mamata Dental College (MDC) a private dental college in India, with its legal address at #5-7-200, Mamata General Hospital Campus, Khammam-507002, Andra Pradesh, India, with its legal representative XXX XXX and Missouri State University ("MSU"), a public university in the United States of America, with its legal address at 901 South National Avenue, Springfield, Missouri, 65897; its registered agent is John McAlear.

## RECITALS

Whereas, MSU and MDC desire to offer programs including, but not limited to, joint educational programs and cultural opportunities for students from both universities; and

Whereas, MSU and MDC have agreed to offer such programs on the terms and conditions contained herein.

NOW, THEREFORE, for and in consideration of their mutual promises and understanding, the parties agree as follows:

### I. PURPOSE AND TRAINING OBJECTIVES OF THE PROGRAMS

**ARTICLE 1** The above recitations are true and correct and incorporated herein by this reference.

**ARTICLE 2** The purpose of the mutual association is to conduct educational and cultural exchanges between the two universities, bring the advantages and strong points of the two parties into play, jointly develop modern courses, and, in the spirit of international cooperation, jointly promote the development of higher education in the two countries and promote understanding and friendship between the two countries.

**ARTICLE 3** Training objectives: To produce qualified professionals with the necessary knowledge and skills suitable for society.

## II. JOINT EDUCATIONAL PROGRAMS

**ARTICLE 4** MDC will assist excellent graduate students who desire to study at MSU. MSU will make available a number of study options to those students as provided in Article 5 of this Agreement.

### **ARTICLE 5** The Graduate Student Program

**5.1** In this program, MDC students may attend MSU to take graduate courses either as non-degree-seeking students or degree-seeking students.

**5.2** MDC students shall be responsible for paying all tuition and fees as well as their living expenses while at MSU. MDC students shall comply with MSU's policies, instructions, and requirements regarding medical insurance.

**5.3** MDC graduate students who apply for and are accepted into an MSU graduate program will be eligible to earn a MSU master's degree. For those students also seeking an MDC master's degree, MSU shall provide a complete record of the academic work performed by the student to MDC. MDC shall accept transfer of coursework completed at MSU in awarding the master's degree.

**5.4** All MDC students entering this program must be proficient in English, which determination shall be made by MSU prior to acceptance into the program. Students can establish their English proficiency by the TOEFL iBT (a minimum score of 79 is required), the IELTS (a minimum score of 6.0 is required), or MSU will send representatives to MDC to administer a language proficiency examination to prospective students. MDC students must request that original copies of their TOEFL iBT scores be sent to MSU directly from the Educational Testing Service and that original copies of their IELTS scores be sent to MSU directly from an IELTS center.

**5.5** All MDC students entering this program must have obtained satisfactory scores on the Graduate Record Examination (GRE) or Graduate Management Admission Test (GMAT), which determination shall be made by MSU prior to acceptance into the program. Additionally, all MDC students entering this program must meet the admission requirements for the graduate program to which they seek admission, and MSU has sole discretion to make admissions, dismissal, and enrollment decisions.



**ARTICLE 6** International Partners Program

MDC students who enroll in any of the joint educational programs referenced in Article 5 of this Agreement will receive the International Partners Scholarship. This scholarship waives seventy-five percent (75%) of the non-resident portion of tuition for academic courses charged by MSU.<sup>1</sup>

**ARTICLE 7** MDC Alumni

Graduates of MDC who want to attend classes at MSU as degree seeking or non-degree seeking students can enroll at MSU at the International Partners Scholarship rate. All other requirements for admission apply. Tuition and fees, to include student health insurance, will be charged to the student's account after enrollment at MSU.

**ARTICLE 8** The English Language Institute

MSU's English Language Institute (ELI) is fully accredited by the Commission on English Language Program Accreditation (CEA) through August 2015. Students wanting to improve their English language proficiency or students needing to improve their English language skills for full admission to MSU may enroll in ELI. MDC students who attend ELI qualify for the ELI Partners Scholarship which provides a \$500 reduction of ELI tuition fees per session. Students do not need to complete a standardized English test to enroll in ELI. There are generally 5 ELI sessions of 8 weeks each session yearly. Start dates generally occur in August, October, January, March, and June.

**ARTICLE 9** Special Programs

MDC is encouraged to request special programs for groups of their students, faculty, or alumni to come to the MSU campus. In most cases, special programs are designed for a minimum of 10 participants. MSU will evaluate each request and reply as quickly as possible with program details, including the cost and description of accommodations and cultural activities. Additionally, weekend trips to local attractions can be included in the program if requested.

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<sup>1</sup> In other words, the recipients shall be charged tuition in the amount of 1.25 multiplied by the amount of MSU's in-state tuition in effect for the semester in which recipient is or will be enrolled.

### III. TERM AND TERMINATION

**ARTICLE 10** This Agreement shall remain in effect from the date of execution for a period of five (5) years. The Agreement may be extended or renewed for additional periods of time upon the mutual written consent of the parties subject to such terms and conditions as the parties shall determine.

**ARTICLE 11** If either party believes the stated purposes of this Agreement are not being fulfilled, the other party shall be notified of the areas of concern in writing. Both parties shall attempt to resolve those concerns through common efforts. If no solution can be achieved, either party may terminate this Agreement by providing written notification at least six (6) months in advance; provided, however, that such termination shall not take effect with respect to students already enrolled in the programs until such students have been provided an opportunity to complete their coursework.

**ARTICLE 12** If the termination is for the other party's non-compliance with any material term of this Agreement, the party desiring to terminate will contact the other party in writing, and such party shall have thirty (30) days to correct the situation (cure period). If the situation is not corrected after the thirty (30) day cure period, the termination shall be effective immediately following the thirty (30) day cure period; provided, however, that such termination shall not take effect with respect to students already enrolled in the programs until such students have been provided an opportunity to complete their coursework.

**ARTICLE 13** MSU may immediately terminate this Agreement in the event that there is a change in law, regulation or policy that results in a material adverse impact on MSU's operation of its programs.

**ARTICLE 14** MDC may immediately terminate this Agreement in the event that there is a change in law, regulation or policy that results in a material adverse impact on MDC's operation of its programs.

### IV. FORCE MAJEURE

**ARTICLE 15** If, as a result of an act of force majeure, including without limitation, an act of nature, war, riot, labor dispute, strike, threat thereof, intervention of a government agency or instrumentality, or other occurrence beyond the reasonable control of either party, a party is hindered in performing its obligations hereunder or is thereby rendered unable to perform its obligation hereunder, then, in such event, such party shall have the right, upon notifying the other of the occurrence of force majeure as herein defined, to suspend

performance until the event of force majeure has passed. In the event that either party is unable to perform for a period in excess of two (2) months at any time after the commencement date of this Agreement due to an act of force majeure, the other party may, at its option, terminate the Agreement.

## V. COMPLIANCE

**ARTICLE 16** The parties agree to comply with all applicable laws, regulations, and policies. Such applicable laws shall include but not be limited to the Foreign Corrupt Practices Act ("FCPA"), 15 U.S.C. § 78dd-1, *et seq.* MDC further agrees to indemnify and hold harmless MSU and MSU's employees, officers, and directors from any and all criminal or civil liabilities or fines incurred or threatened (as well as attorneys' fees and court costs related thereto) directly or indirectly related to MDC's failure to comply with applicable laws, regulations, and policies (including but not limited to the FCPA).

**ARTICLE 17** MDC further agrees to participate in such legal, compliance, and/or best practices training and/or monitoring as MSU in its discretion requires to ensure compliance with all applicable laws, regulations, and policies (including but not limited to the FCPA) or for any other reason.

## VI. MISCELLANEOUS

**ARTICLE 18** The provisions of this Agreement are expressly limited to the relationship between MDC and MSU with respect to the educational undertaking herein described. Nothing herein shall prevent either MDC or MSU from embarking upon other or additional programs so long as the performance of other contracts does not affect the respective party's performance hereunder. This Agreement does not discourage continued discussions between the parties to look at other programs in the future, which would have mutual benefit.

**18.1** The parties will engage in further discussions about the specific details of the proposed items in this Agreement. Any additional agreements reached will be subject to the approval of the governing bodies of each party.

**ARTICLE 19** This Agreement shall be governed by and construed in accordance with the laws of the United States of America, State of Missouri.

**ARTICLE 20** The parties are independent contractors of one another. Nothing in this Agreement shall be construed to create a partnership, joint



venture, agency, or employment relationship between the parties. Neither party is authorized or empowered to act as agent for the other for any purpose and shall not on behalf of the other enter into any contract, warranty, or representation as to any matter.

**ARTICLE 21** Except as otherwise expressly authorized in writing by MSU, MDC shall do business in its own name and shall not trade upon the name or credit of MSU. All brochures, advertisements or other solicitations for the programs must be submitted for written approval in advance by MSU. This Agreement confers no rights upon MDC to use the logos, marks and likeness of MSU in any advertising except as authorized by MSU in writing in accordance with the provisions of this paragraph.

**ARTICLE 22** Except as otherwise expressly authorized in writing by MDC, MSU shall do business in its own name and shall not trade upon the name or credit of MDC. All brochures, advertisements or other solicitations for the programs must be submitted for written approval in advance by MDC. This Agreement confers no rights upon MSU to use the logos, marks and likeness of MDC in any advertising except as authorized by MDC in writing in accordance with the provisions of this paragraph.

**ARTICLE 23** MSU and MDC shall not discriminate against any person on the basis of race, sex, age, religion, national origin, color, disability/handicap, or marital status in the performance of this Agreement.

**ARTICLE 24** Neither party shall assign this Agreement or assign or delegate any of its obligations under this Agreement to any third party without the other party's prior written consent.

**ARTICLE 25** This Agreement constitutes the entire agreement among the parties with respect to the subject matter contemplated herein. 

## ARTICLE 1: STUDENT EXCHANGES

1. The primary purpose of this agreement is to establish a clinical student exchange program between the Mamata Dental College (MDC), Telangana, India, and the Mamata Medical College (MMC), Khammam, Telangana
2. The exact number of students exchanged per year (up to six) shall be by mutual agreement and may not necessarily be exactly in balance. The number of students exchanged will be subject to availability of the designated clinical tutor's/preceptor's and institution's capability to absorb the students into the daily operation. The number of students exchanged in any year must be approved in writing by the Dean of the accepting college.
3. Each institution, conforming to the admission requirements of the host institution' shall accept and enroll exchange students for a period of clinical education experiences lasting upto two months. The host institution will not consider the exchange student an employee of the institution, but rather a student in the clinical education phase of his/her professional education. Each institution will assume full responsibility in the assessment and selection of qualified candidates. These students will have completed, at least, four years of their course at their home institution.
4. Eligibility for participation in this Exchange will be determined without regard to race, sex, color, religion, sexual orientation, marital status, national origin, age, or beliefs, both institutions does not discriminate on the basis of race, color, national origin, ethnic origin, religion, creed, age, physical or mental disability, veteran status, uniformed service, political belief, sex, sexual orientation, gender identity, gender expression, pregnancy, marital status, genetic information, social or economic status.
5. All students, by accepting a place on the Exchange Program, agree to abide by the Regulations, Rules and Statutes of the host institution and its governmental entities.
6. Exchange students will receive the services normally provided to the home students of each institution and will have the same rights and responsibilities afforded to the home students. In addition, the host institution undertakes to provide specific assistance to incoming students with regard to accommodation, induction and orientation to the host environment.
7. Students participating in the exchange will be responsible for paying their individual tuition fees at their home institutions.
8. Students will also be responsible for transportation costs to and from the receiving institution. Students are responsible for all costs incurred at the host institution, those involving books, stationery, study materials and course-specific fees such as key deposits, cost of fieldwork, laboratory deposits. In addition, students will pay their own accommodation (room and board) and living costs. Students are responsible for the costs of health and other insurance in line with current regulations in the host institution and as may be varied from time to time by that institution. Students must comply with all Health Regulations currently in force in host institution.
9. The obligations of each institution are limited under this agreement to the exchange of students and do not extend to partners or dependents. Expenses of accompanying partners and/or dependents are the responsibility of the exchange student.

10. Default of any payment due to the host institution will be considered default in the home institution and the appropriate sanctions will be applied by the home institution to attempt to recover such debt on behalf of the host institution.
11. The nature of the experiences shall be jointly arranged by the student's program at the home institution, and by the designated preceptor/clinical tutor at the host institution. The home institution shall give at least ninety (90) days' notice of the student's assignment to the designated preceptor at the host institution. The host institution reserves the right of final approval of the admission of a student. The academic program for each student shall have been determined before departure and shall be agreed between the appropriate members of Academic Staff/Faculty in the home and host institutions according to their normal custom and practice. The home institution will also specify any credit arising from courses/modules and practice. The home institution will also specify any credit arising from courses/modules taken at the host institution that will be allowed to count to the award of the home institution. The host institution's clinical tutor/preceptor shall provide learning objectives and guidelines of the clinical education experience. and shall provide written communication regarding the student's performance in providing clinical experiences. The host institution may withdraw a student from his/her clinical education experience when, in the host institution's judgement, the clinical experiences do not meet the needs of the student.
12. The host institution, and the designated chief clinical tutor/preceptor, shall, where applicable:
  - a. Provide clinical educational experiences as stated in the objectives and guidelines from the host institution, and supervision appropriate to the academic and clinical level of assigned students.
  - b. Provide the physical facilities and other equipment necessary for clinical education experiences.
  - c. Request that the College withdraw a student from his/her assigned clinical education experiences.
  - d. Request that the College withdraw a student from his/her assigned clinical education experience, when his/her conduct or performance is unsatisfactory.
  - e. Complete forms requested by the College, such as: general information forms, student evaluation report, etc.
13. The student shall:
  - a. Have the responsibility of transportation to and from the host institution, and on any reasonable special assignment by the designated preceptor.
  - b. Be responsible for his/her own illness.
  - c. Complete health forms requested by the designated clinical tutor/preceptor and host institution, if applicable.
  - d. Be responsible for following the administrative policies of the designated clinical tutor/preceptor and/or host institution.
  - e. Be responsible for providing his/her own clinical lab costs.
  - f. Notify the designated clinical tutor/preceptor of his/her intended time of arrival, and be responsible for reporting to the designated individual at the host institution on time.
  - g. Have an enrollment proposal, approved both by the home institution and the host institution and be deemed academically qualified to successfully complete the designated subjects at the host institution.

- h. Have good knowledge of the English language for those attending UKY. Other language skills may be required by either institution. This will be verified on request by the host institution.
14. The home institution shall send only such students as are, to the home institution's knowledge, in good health at the time of reporting for their clinical education. The home institution shall forward to the designated clinical tutor/preceptor a summary of the student's training and experience, which shall include at least information on the student's general health, related education and experience.


#### ARTICLE 2: TERMS
